Public Unconstitutionality Action Admitted to Review by the Constitutional Court of Ecuador

The Court will consider the substantive arguments concerning violation of the State's obligations regarding the rights of refugees caused by the implementation of Executive Decree No. 1182

Quito, Ecuador - Via this press release, we would like to inform that Ecuador's Constitutional Court has declared that the public unconstitutionality action filed by Asylum Access Ecuador (AAE) is admissible. The constitutional action challenges certain provisions of Ecuador's regulation of the right to asylum. Therefore, the Court will consider its substantive arguments.

In summary, the regulations contemplated by Decree 1182 repeatedly violate refugee rights, which are guaranteed by Article 41 of the Constitution of the Republic of Ecuador, among others, as well as through the international instruments that it enshrines. The Constitution guarantees that asylum-seekers must be guaranteed access to the exercise of their rights, even if their respective applications are pending. Further, this decree patently violates the principle of non-refoulement. Finally, the action argues that the terms provided by Decree 1182 violate the right to due process, precluding an individual's access to adequate time and means to prepare a defense.

Carmen Atkins, coordinator of Strategic Litigation at AAE, stated, "Only about 10 percent of unconstitutionality actions are declared admissible, thus, by itself, this is a great achievement."
